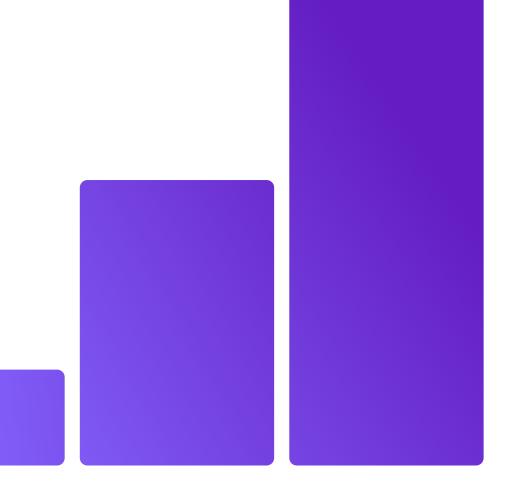

	The Victorian property market is bursting with a fusion of competing factors, sparking questions as to whether the worst is over. One thing is for certain, the taxation of small-scale property developments is not getting any simpler!
	This session will work through various stages of the development lifecycle highlighting key considerations, such as income tax, GST, and basics of state tax considerations.
	Join us as we work through the practical implications of small-scale property developments, answering questions such as, what happens if an expected sale doesn't go through? And, what are the implications of a change of intention?

	The landscape of state taxes is continuously evolving, with new taxes being introduced and existing ones expanding. One such change is the Victorian Vacant Residential Land Tax (VRLT), which, could now potentially apply to any residential land in Victoria. Further expansion is set to take effect 1 January 2026.
	In this session, you'll gain a clear understanding of the VRLT, including practical examples that illustrate when it may apply, the circumstances under which you could qualify for an exemption, and proactive measures to prevent the tax from affecting you.
	Even if you're not based in Victoria, this session is still invaluable. Given the potential for other states and territories to introduce similar legislation—just as we saw with foreign owner surcharges in the past—it's important to stay ahead of these changes.
	Additionally, we'll provide a brief overview of the new short stay levy, often referred to as the "Airbnb tax," to keep you informed of other emerging tax developments.

	Capital Gains Tax (CGT) is fraught with complexities, and even the most seasoned tax practitioners can encounter unexpected hurdles. In this practical session, Michael will delve into a collection of common CGT issues, uncovering hidden traps and opportunities that may arise in practice.
	With the Small Business CGT concessions under increased ATO scrutiny, understanding the nuances of the eligibility criteria is more critical than ever. This session will revisit the key eligibility requirements for these concessions and explore other common CGT pitfalls, including using the small business restructure rollover (Subdivision 328-G) incorrectly and misapplication of the market value substitution rule.
	With a practical, solutions-focused approach, this session will equip you with strategies to navigate these issues with ease and ensure your clients can effectively access CGT relief where available.

Finally, should we be lucky enough to find the golden ticket and be assessed on capital account, we will work through a practical, solutions-focused approach to equip us all with strategies to navigate through the curly GGT provisions.

	With an increasingly mobile workforce and complex tax laws across borders, proper planning for changes in residency is essential. This session will consider several tips and traps including (but not limited to):
	<ul> <li>Residency and temporary residency for individuals and fact patterns that might indicate a change.</li> <li>Commencement and cessation of Australian tax residency and temporary residency and key watch-outs.</li> <li>Tax treaty tie-breaker provisions for individuals.</li> <li>Dealing with related structures such as companies, trusts and retirement funds.</li> </ul>

We'll kick off by delving into a practical application of the CGT small business relief provisions, with the myriad of issues to consider in the context of an asset disposal. We will then examine the ATO's current approach to debt collection and how it demands a new response from advisers, including what to do when your client receives a Director Penalty Notice. The chocolate ganache for this workshop will involve a deep dive into the nuances of tax residence planning, where there are various choices and elections that require consideration, which we will overlay with the complexities of residency tie-breaker rules and other interesting issues, such as whether Div 7A can apply to loans from a foreign family company.

	Everyone makes mistakes sometimes – even the most compliant taxpayers and the best advisors!
	This session delves into an area that gives rise to common misconceptions and concerns. How should taxpayers correct GST mistakes? Are all mistakes created equal, or are some more significant (requiring a different approaches)? What GST impacts do bad and doubtful debts have for our clients?
	Common adjustments and corrections are sometimes simpler (or more complex!) than they might appear at first blush. It is crucial that we guide our clients in the right direction when these issues arise.
	Rachel will also discuss the importance of the ongoing monitoring and broader consideration of our clients' enterprises and their purposes, to provide the best vantage point from which to proactively address any changes of purpose and other changes that can alter our clients' registration and compliance requirements and entitlements.
